MASHAKENI VILLAGE SEEDLING NURSERY LAUNCH

The satellite seeding nursery was launched at Mashakeni village with heirloom organic seeds from *livingseeds.co.za*. The nursery is managed by local women who were trained on nursery management and financial management. The nursery will provide community members with top quality heirloom organic seedlings at reasonable prices and will also bring an income to these women. "This seedling nursery came at right time. Community members do not have enough food. We will encourage them to plant so that they have nutritious food in times like this" a local woman explains. There will be a mentorship from Woza Moya for a period of one year for these women.

FOOD GARDENING IN TIMES OF COVID 19 CASE STUDY THULI MTOLO: SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS MANAGER

Bongie Chiliza was born and grew up in Bhensela. She survives by selling fruits in Ixopo town. Her two daughters were working in hospitality industry until Covid 19 pandemic and lockdown regulations knock in South Africa. During lockdown they lost their jobs. Due to lockdown regulations she was struggling to sell her fruits in town and this has resulted having insufficient food. Woza Moya community care giver visited the family and she liaises with our food garden champion to intervene. Food garden champion introduced Bongi to door size garden and she was interested to start her own door size garden. Together with her daughters they collected woods for fencing their door size garden. Woza Moya provided training, seedlings and compost to Bongi. She planted the vegetables with the help of food garden champion. Bongi and her daughters are able to survive and have healthy food. They are also encouraging their neighbours to start door size gardens.
