In February we experienced heavy rainfalls, much more than usual. This is great news for the new rainwater harvesting systems that Woza Moya, funded by MAMAS Emergency Relief Fund, has just installed in five outlying regions of Ufafa valley. Local builders were sourced in each village to install these rain-water harvesting systems. The five rainwater harvesting systems with the holding capacity of 10,000L each will increase community water storage by 50,000 litres! Now these community members will have enough water for domestic use, hand washing and gardening.

Climate change is causing severe water shortages in our area. Community members collect water from rivers, streams and boreholes, which usually run dry in the winter months. These water sources are often also dirty due to being shared with animals making waterborne illnesses a problem. Human behaviour is a major reason as to why our water sources become polluted, as people throw their rubbish, in particular babies' nappies and sanitary pads in the streams and rivers. We have much work to do around Environmental management in our community.



Sue attended the 2nd Module of the 12 month legacy programme with 11 other Founder Directors and the LEGACY team. They spent a week in the beautiful Drakensburg Mountains reflecting on their journeys thus far towards successful transitions for both themselves and organisations. Legacy facilitators employed various creative tools to help participants to dig deep and see more clearly. Various models of transitions, succession plans, organisational strengthening were shared and discussed. A common challenge for many in the group was how and when to inform significant others of our plans to move on, Sue said. She added that visualising their new lives beyond their organisations was a scary and helpful process. Some of the Founder Directors began to see just how all consumed they have been by the organisations that they gave birth to.
