April 27th is Freedom Day in South Africa. 27 years ago we held our first democratic elections. Since 1994, April has been celebrated as Freedom Month especially for young people known as born-frees! Full of hope for a better life and future we at Woza Moya have been supporting young people in a number of ways. In April two local youth interns, joined our team, for 9 months, Bongiwe Dlamini, 21 and Sandile Radebe, 19. Our Youth organised a talent show for some 250 young people. 6 young local stakeholders in Ufafa replaced our elderly members, on the Woza Moya Community Advisory Council.

WE ARE ALL EQUAL

Our first talent show since lockdown a year ago was held at a Sheshe community hall in the area of KwaNkosi. Addressing the scourge of gender based violence, our youth team adopted the slogan #SONKE SIYALINGANA" meaning "we are all equal". Due to Covid-19 only 250 youth were allowed to enter the hall. The process of screening each person, filling in a register, ensuring thorough sanitizing, delayed the start by a few hours, resulting in the event continuing into the night, until 18:20. Keeping a close eye on young people who removed their masks and asking them to leave the hall if necessary was another challenge. Despite all this, it was a great day, with 18 groups participating, presenting various genres, such as Maskandi, Indlamu, Scathamiya, Hip Hop, Gumboot Dance, Gospel, Poets.
