There is no easy solution, but it requires each and every one of us to work together to overcome it. Woza Moyas philosophy is to raise awareness and reject violence every day, rather than just during the 16 days of Activism which runs from 25 November to 10 December.

This year beneficiaries from our Afterschool programme, Good Guys Club and PowerGirls came together and organised a silent march in the Chibini Village. They marched carrying hand made signs and sang songs to try raise awareness in the community. We were overwhelmed by the communities positive response. They waved showing support as children walked passed their households.

We also continue to provide psychosocial support for parents and caregivers to improve their well-being and to adequately support the needs of children.
