





DEVASTATING FLOODING IN KZN

Millions of people across our province were affected by the heavy rains and subsequent flooding in April. The Ufafa Valley Community was not spared and Woza Moya needed to close for two days to ensure that staff were safe. Beneficiaries mud houses were washed away in the process losing vital possessions such ID documents, birth certificates and Road to Health Cards. Crops and livestock were also destroyed wich will impact this years harvest. Some roads in our community are now impassable hindering access to some villages, and it is difficult for community members to reach Ixopo town where they can find government departments such as hospitals, clinics, Department of Home affairs and Department of Social Development. This is another devastating blow to Ufafa valley families who are still trying to put their lives together after the Covid 19 pandemic and the rioting and looting less than two years ago. We found ourselves in emergency relief mode, doing trauma counselling, delivering food vouchers and other necessities to households in desperate need. The team at Woza Moya sends out its heartfelt condolenses to all those who lost loved ones, property and possesions during the flood.

To include gender sensitization in the school curriculum and teacher training programs because we feel that is where we can collectively make a start. To make public transport safe and accessible for women and train health care workers on early detection of domestic violence and lastly to talk openly to our children and friends about gender-based violence.
