In February we took time to celebrate our harvest. Home and community gardeners were invited to join our Annual Food Farming Festival. Woza Moya distributed hundreds of seedling packages to the Ufafa Valley gardeners to help them rebuild after heavy rains had destroyed their gardens. As a result their gardens have bounced back and the gardeners were able to feed their families and sell the surplus to community members. Former Chief Thokozile Ndlovu, who is also a community gardener, also attended the Festival and emphasised the importance of community gardens and how these gardens can alleviate poverty. MEASLES VACCINE CAMPAIGN

Woza Moya in partnership with the Department of Health hosted its first Mobile Clinic site visit of the year as we embarked on our Measles Vaccination Campaign. 180 children from 6 months to 15 years old were vaccinated and their parents were checked that they had the required vaccinations at the same time. There was also a catch up immunization for under vaccinated children, screening for malnutrition, Vitamin A drop and deworming. At Woza Moya addressing health issues is one of our main priorities, especially the health of children.
