STORIES OF CHANGE

Masakhane is a self-help savings group which was started in May 2015 when 20 women and neighbors got together to help improve their livelihoods. Group member Mama Octavia Ngcobo, who is known to be very shy and quiet, came up with the idea for the group to start a small business. She shared her knowledge and taught them how to make floor polish, which is relatively simple and cheap to produce. The group is now selling their floor polish in the community at a very affordable price. This is a great boost to the groups income.
