WHAT YOU MISSED

This summer has brought heavy rains and severe thunderstorms, particularly over the past three weeks. This has affected more than 100 households across Ufafa Valley. Some roads were damaged making access to some villages difficult, mud houses were destroyed and crops were damaged too. Woza Moya intervened by issuing food parcels, clothes and seedlings to 100 community members that were affected.

NEW YEAR, NEW PROJECT

Load shedding has affected our work since 2020. Office staff are generally the ones most affected, but it has a ripple affect which extends to the community members who are unable to access our services during load shedding hours. This month we said 'Goodbye to load shedding' thanks to a solar panel system that was generously donated by *Kinderfonds MAMAS*. With this new source of power we can ensure Woza Moya continues to work even during load shedding hours and it could even help reduce the electricity bill.
